Being a culturally proficient leader is more than your professional role, this is learning for all of us as helping professionals. Whether a leader in the workplace or in the community, your title is not of importance. What is important is the difference you want to make and are making in the lives of your community, workplace, and clients. A culturally proficient leader is one who intentionally focuses on equity, diversity, and resources to guide others on their own journey of cultural proficiency. The journey to becoming a culturally proficient leader is an individual journey that will lead to organizational change. This full day event will cover the beginning steps of starting that individual journey, as well as many resources and tools. We will discuss how individuals become culturally proficient leaders and make systemic organizational change. Throughout the day, we will discuss our ethical obligation as social workers, counselors, case managers, and nurses regarding cultural proficient leadership. By the end of this interactive workshop, participants will have a new perspective on their role as culturally proficient leaders and on building a culturally proficient and equitable community within their organization.
