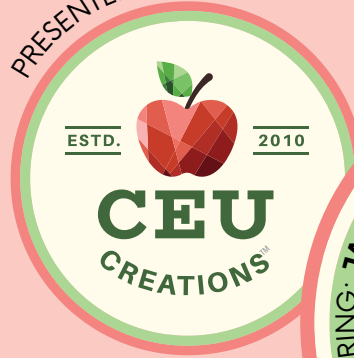

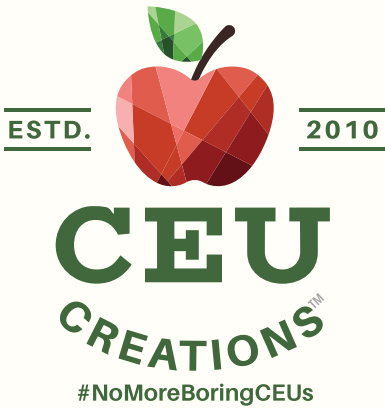

Jason Lesandrini, PhD, FACHE, LPEC, HEC-C, has been the leader of the ethics department for numerous healthcare organizations. In these roles, Dr. Lesandrini provides leadership and resources to promote ethical behavior and decision-making aligned with the mission, vision, and values of the health systems. He is focused on building capacity through ethical decision-making and development of health system staff. Dr. Lesandrini is a faculty member for the Physician Assistant Programs at Mercer University (Atlanta Campus) South College (Atlanta Campus), and teaches undergraduates at Georgia Tech. In addition, has worked as an ethics resource for numerous national professional organizations. He received a Master of Arts degree in philosophy from Georgia State University, a Bachelor of Arts degree in philosophy from Michigan State University and his PhD in Healthcare Ethics from Duquesne University in 2024.

Jason is also the founder and principal of The Ethics Architect, an outcomes-driven healthcare consulting firm specializing in the assessment and execution of ethics programming, the creation of ethical cultures, and developing ethical leaders.
